



**LOS ANGELES TIMES OLYMPIC PLANT**

DESCRIPTION: A new facility for the Los Angeles Times that consolidated a series of scattered operations into a single facility on a 26-acre site. This 650,000 square-foot facility houses the receiving, printing, and delivery to vehicle functions for the Los Angeles Times newspaper. Paper stock is delivered by rail and transferred by automated vehicles to the printing presses. The newspapers are then transferred to newsprint handling for dispatch by truck. Adjacent to the public entry and viewing lobby, a two-story area accommodates offices for production staff and cafeteria, medical facility, auditorium and fitness center. The plant also features an eleven-bay service garage to maintain and repair the Times' fleet of 150 trucks and 100 cars.
