



**ONTARIO INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT TERMINAL EXPANSION**  
 ONTARIO, CALIFORNIA

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**COMPLETION:** 1998

**DESCRIPTION:** Ontario International Airport located in Ontario, California is ranked among the 100 busiest airports in the world. In order to accommodate current airport functions and meet projected growth, the project was divided into two phases. Phase one includes the design of two terminals totaling 26 gates and 530,000 square feet able to accommodate 9 million annual passengers. The design consists of a linear structure, which effectively utilizes the narrow north/south dimension of the site parallel to the airfield. This configuration allows the integration of a single level roadway with a double-level terminal. Alternating enplaning and deplaning functions are extended over the entire length of the terminal area resulting in added convenience for commuters and flexibility for airline operations.

**COST:** \$ 270 million  
**ROLE:** Anthony Lumsden was the Architectural Designer of this project while at DMJM. Anthony Lumsden and AJLA was the design consultant throughout the construction phase.  
**STATUS:** Project is built, four months ahead of schedule and \$26 million under budget.
